
Former Good Shepherd Center Board of Directors President

Deacon Michael Illerbrun has graciously assumed the Board of Directors President mantle to continue in the footsteps of Deacon Steve Rangel. He has served as a member on the Board of Directors for five years so he is greatly experienced with Good Shepherd Center already.

Deacon Michael gave us a quick overview of how he landed with us here:

Born in northern Appalachia to a lower middle-class working family, both of his parents worked their entire lives and had six children at home.

After high school he attended the University of Texas where he met and married the love of his life, his wonderful wife, Donna.

After graduation he joined the Air Force and he and Donna began to travel the world in service to the nation for the next 26 years. He retired in Albuquerque as a Lieutenant Colonel.

Along the way he assumed more and more responsibility in the Church. He was a lector, eucharistic minister, finance council

member and Pastoral Council president. He finally was ordained as a deacon of the Church in 2009 here in the Archdiocese of Santa Fe.

He attained a Bachelor's Degree in government and two Master's Degrees—one in Public Administration and one in Theology.

He has worked at Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Catholic Church for the past 18 years as the Director of Faith Formation and now as the Pastoral Associate.

He is also on the Deacon Council for the Archdiocese as well as on the Deacon Formation Board.

He and his wife have three wonderful children of whom they are very proud and 11 grandchildren.


Coffee is a staple of our guests' days, especially as the weather turns colder. Please help keep the supply percolating. All ground coffee appreciated.

Toward Sustainability

Laundry is a constant chore here at Good Shepherd, with all overnight linens requiring washing every day. Using our dryers is both expensive and costly for the environement and we have made a step toward lessening both burdens.

With an annual average of 310 dry and sunny days, Albuquerque is the perfect place to take advantage of the power of the sun. At the beginning of July, we installed heavy-duty retractable clotheslines that are able to dry those linens without need for additional power. Nature has provided us with the ultimate clothes dryer system!

It's through efforts like this that Good Shepherd Center strives to be a good steward to our Earth and our community. Our new line-drying process frees up resources that can be better put toward other areas in our mission to help those in need.


